Conference Reports

Even though there has not been an MCDM Conference in 2003, there has been much activity within other conferences and working groups. The following is just what we know about ... there must be much more. If you have been at a conference with a significant MCDA component, let us know about it and we'll pass on the news next time.

The **EURO/INFORMS Joint International Conference** held in Istanbul, Turkey (6-10 July, 2003) attracted a large contingent of multi-criteria people amongst the 1500 delegates, presenting in 2 streams and covering a wide range of topics. Related streams in group decision and negotiation, performance measurement, and other areas meant that we were constantly having to choose between several interesting papers – we never made it into the outdoor swimming pool all week!

The **Eighth International Summer School on Multicriteria Decision Aid** was held at GERAD, Montreal, Québec, Canada (26 May - 6 June 2003). Its theme was "Sustainable resources management and concertation: processes and tools".

This event, organized by Jean-Philippe Waub, attracted over 20 "students" who learned from 13 international experts on MCDM. They all look as if they were enjoying themselves in the photographs we've seen.

The **Second International Conference on Evolutionary Multi-Criterion Optimization (EMO 2003)** - Faro, Portugal (8-11 April, 2003) was a successful event, attracting 95 delegates, which tried to forge links with MCDM. Pekka Korhonen (Helsinki School of Economics, Finland) was a keynote speaker and Valerie Belton (Univ. of Strathclyde, Scotland) and Andrzej Jaszkiwicz (Poznan Univ. of Technology, Poland) presented Tutorial Papers. Xavier Gandibleux completed an MCDM quartet.

The **European Working Group on MCDA** met in Viterbo, Italy, for its **57th Meeting**, in March, with the theme "MCDA and economical evaluation of environmental goods", and its organiser was A. Scarelli, (University of Tuscia). It met again in October, in Moscow for the 58th meeting, organised by Alexey Petrovsky. The theme was "MCDA and Verbal Decision Analysis" (In Memoriam of Oleg I. Larichev).

It was with great sadness that we received the news about the death of Oleg Larichev in January this year. An active member of the MCDM Society, and an outstanding researcher, he has developed an important branch in our field, integrating MCDM with behavioural decision making.

Freerk Lootsma

Several months later, in May this year, it was with equal shock and sadness that we heard of the sudden death of Freerk Lootsma. Freerk was also an active member of the MCDM community who contributed significantly to the professional development of the field.

Both Oleg and Freerk will be sadly missed by the MCDM community and once again we would like to record our sympathy to their families and friends.
