Future MCDM Conferences

The **next MCDM Conference** will be hosted in summer (northern hemisphere) 2004, by Bill Wedley at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver. The exact venue and dates are currently being finalized – we will email this information to everyone early in the New Year.

We are also in the process of discussion with Kostas Zopounidis of the Technical University of Crete in Chania, with a view to their hosting the conference there in the **summer of 2006**.

First MCDM Winter Conference, February 2002 – Semmering, Austria

Firstly, another big "Thank You" – this time to Rudolf Vetschera and Mikulas Luptacik for an MCDM "1st" – the organization of a very enjoyable and successful Winter Conference held in Semmering earlier this year. Unfortunately (or fortunately, depending on your perspective) it was not as wintry as it might have been – nevertheless, many of the 99 delegates from 31 countries found somewhere to ski and the rest of us enjoyed the views, the food and the sauna! Lapland next time?

Those of you who were not at the Conference may not yet know of the honours which were bestowed. Professor Jaap Spronk was awarded the **MCDM Gold Medal** and Professor Masatoshi Sakawa was warded the **Georg Cantor Award**.

Congratulations to both Jaap and Masatoshi!

The **Wiley Prize** for the best application paper presented at the conference was hotly contested and the judges faced a very difficult decision. Finally it was decided that two awards should be made, to Matthias Ehrgott (New Zealand) and to Ali Sharifi (The Netherlands) and his co-authors W. H. van den Toorn, A. Rico and M. Emmanuel.

These four papers (the medallists and the prize winners) will be published as a special issue of the Journal of Multicriteria Decision Analysis.

Three **special issues of journals** are to be published from selected papers presented during the conference:

- On Group Decision and Negotiation Support and Applications at CEJOR (Central European Journal of Operations Research) – guest editors: Gregory Kersten and Rudolf Vetschera.
- On Methodological Foundations of MCDM at EJOR (European Journal of Operational Research) – guest editors: Wlodzimierz Ogryczak and Rudolf Vetschera.
- On Applications of MCDM at JMCDA (Journal of Multi-Criteria Decision Analysis) – guest editors: Matthias Ehrgott and Mikulas Luptacik.
